Topic: The Abolition of Nuclear Weapons

The General Assembly.

Given that nuclear weapons are the most devastating and effective weapon humanity has ever created at destroying human life, and are already responsible for the deaths of thousands and numerous conflicts across the globe,

Noting that the only reason a country would need to stockpile nuclear weapons is to protect itself from another country with nuclear weapons,

- 1. Calls for the removal of the nuclear weapons and facilities of each and every country, and the infrastructure used for the construction of nuclear weapons to be either destroyed or repurposed as a new facility for creating Nuclear Energy under the surveillance of the United Nations within a time constraint of 10 years;
- 2. Authorizes the only nuclear weapons are to be owned by the United Nations and are only to be used in a case where there is unanimous support from all members of the United Nations General Assembly;
- 3. <u>Stressing</u> the fact that the United Nations faces significant financial obstacles and is in need of reform, particularly in the humanitarian realm,

- Encourages all relevant agencies of the United Nations to collaborate more closely with countries to eliminate the unfit of society, namely the delinquent criminals;
